10th Anniversary of Jester Book

Benefited Jester & Pharley Phund

Renowned jazz pianist David Benoit joined more than 250 fans of *The Jester Has Lost His Jingle* in celebration of the book's 10th anniversary at the home of Carolyn and Julian Elliott of Palos Verdes Estates. The Phund's goal is to provide a copy of *The Jester* book and Jester & Pharley doll to every child diagnosed with cancer nationwide. Cost to do so for the 12,500 children who will contract the disease in the next year is \$550,000.

The *New York Times* best-seller was written and illustrated by David Saltzman, a Chadwick graduate who died of Hodgkin's disease in 1990 shortly after his graduation from Yale. The book, published posthumously in 1995 by his family, and *The Jester & Pharley* doll are widely used by health professionals.
